

Deltona library bigger, better

At a time when some public libraries in Volusia County are on the chopping block, Deltona is fortunate to be home to one that has been expanded and improved. The Deltona Regional Library, 2150 Eustace Ave., reopened in October, 2009 after 15 months of renovation, and other parts of the library complex – the Lyonia Environmental Center and the Deltona Amphitheater – were unveiled at the same time. The library doubled in size and has many components that appeal to children of all ages. These may be of particular interest to teenagers:

- A new teen area, two rooms, is equipped with Wii games and computers specifically for teen use. The library plans new programs, including special activities for Teen Read Week. Already, teen events include movies at 4 p.m. Mondays, Wii gaming at 4 p.m. Monday through Thursday, crafts at 4 p.m. Tuesdays, “Wild Card” at 4 p.m. Wednesdays and games at 4 p.m. Thursdays.
- The Environmental Learning Center is 4,000 square feet developed to encourage discovery and exploration of Volusia County’s ecosystems. The Lyonia Environmental Center includes two classrooms, an exhibit gallery, a visiting scientist’s workroom, and a coffee and gift shop.
